George Anthony Lutfy, age 91, passed away November 18, 2017 at his home in Sterling Heights, MI, surrounded by his loving family and friends.

After serving in the United States Navy during World War II, George graduated from Wayne University in Detroit with a degree in pharmacy, and subsequently taught at the university as well. He opened Lutfy Pharmacy in 1959, where he worked until he sold his business in 1984, not fully retiring from his beloved trade until the age of 90.

George was a member of St Jane Frances de Chantal church, and also served as a Fourth Degree Knight in the Knights of Columbus. George will be remembered for his boundless energy, gift of gab, love of food, and relentless “negotiating” skills.
