“ I am Tom's surviving brother John, his junior by 10 years, and would like to mention some things not included in his obituary.

Tom didn't do anything half-baked. When he had a new interest, he jumped in with both feet and usually gained expertise. When he became a salesman at a young age, he learned all the tricks of the trade

and could close any deal. He taught many many of us the "Art of the Deal" and knew at least 25 "closing" techniques on which he could draw when dealing with a particularly tough sale. His abilities were

well recognized by his real estate peers and gained him inclusion in the "Million Dollar Round Table" and the "Who's Who" of Real Estate as well as of Education. He was very proud of these

accomplishments.

Mentioning the other chariot my Ben-Hur-like brother rode, as an educator, he taught 3rd graders for many years and instilled in even the most irascible of them the desire to read books and do mathematical computations in their heads that most of us can't do with a calculator. He came up

with a system of teaching these techniques so that every single student in every single 3rd grade class he shepherded knew them by rote by the time they went to the next grade. I witnessed this as a guest in

his classroom on more than one occasion.

Tom was appreciative of the finer things in life, and literally gave me my beginning knowledge and love of art and music, enough so I could run with the ball and create a 45- year professional career in music

and the ability to sketch with perspective and shading served me in my career as a CAD design engineer. He and I attended the Rembrandt, Van Gogh and Faberge at the Detroit Institute of Arts.

At E.F. McDonald travel agency, Tom was their graphic artist and created many displays

and layouts for Travel Agency windows and magazine ads, saying "Fly E.F. McDonald and Pan American" and so on. Later, Tom and his wife, Judy would get to see some of the places advertized.

Once on the Seine river in Paris, Tom handily took 1st place in a painting contest as they motored past Notre Dame cathedral. Tom is one of a few people who walked through King Tutankhamun's tomb

and actually understood most of the objects he saw.

My brother had many life-experiences which he could relate in a way that made you feel you had been with him. Some of these included being an actual cowboy on my Father's half-brother's ranch in

Oklahoma. (ref. Uncle George H. Boyd).

Along with Tom's twin, my other accomplished brother, Jerry, Captain in the Sterling

Heights Fire Department, Tom attended RETS electronic schools, and when he was finished with this and moved on to

other interests, I was the lucky inheritor of his manuals from which I learned all I know about repairing nearly any electronic device today. "Tuck" or "Pyunk" (pajak - spider in polish), his nicknames, between

us, earned double Masters degrees in his academic career. He was fluent in Spanish language, which served him and his lovely wife Judy in their considerable world travels.

We all worked side by side in my father's tool and die shop in Royal Oak, cutting oil, mixed with sweat, dripping off of our elbows in July, while we operated drill presses, lathes, broaches on Fruehauf brake

slack adjusters, and welded brake and clutch pedals for the famous Ferguson tractor and very close tolerance Ross pneumatic valve bodies.

Thomas and I enjoyed many breakfasts together near the end of his life, and we spoke of many interesting and comical things, as well as grave subjects. I often urged him to write the "Head Math" book,

comprising the techniques he'd taught so many.

I can see him now, restored, tall gritting his teeth and shirtless, whipping the spinnaker sail into submission with gloved hands, while correcting his posture on a 30 degree angle to the heeling hull as it glides

past the other contenders in Heaven's Yatch race, and taking the 1st place. My big brother, non-toxic masculinity at i
