Alfreda Kudla, of Hamtramck, passed away on May 27, 2026 at the age of 79. She was a woman whose gentle heart, quiet strength, and deep faith touched everyone who knew her. Above all, she treasured the time she spent with her grandchildren, Andrew and Jacob. Watching them grow was one of her greatest joys, and she celebrated every moment with them.
