Cynthia Ann (NEE Cygan)Wowk, age 66, went home to God peacefully with her family at her side at her home on February 26th, 2012. She was predeceased by her loving husband Michael and her mother Julia. She is survived by her two daughters, Julie and Natalie. Cindy was an adventurous, lovable, selfless woman who had a passion for traveling and a talent for making people smile. Her strong faith and fearless leadership led her to start both the St. Lawrence Applefest in Utica and the St. Josephat Sunflower Festival in Warren. She never lost her fire: at the age of 63 she completed her first triathlon; in the following year she traveled to Africa.
