An enlightened guy, Frank wrote fiction, studied car design and enjoyed books.

He leaves behind unpublished short stories that spin a tale with character, compassion and dreams.

He remembered a wealth of historical car design facts and wrote letters to auto execs with product suggestions and Car & Driver with his opinions. He photographed the classic cars of the 1950's, 60's and 70's and leaves behind a inventory of documented photo negatives to publish several books. He browsed used bookstores and built a collection of unique and modern books that demonstrated he was extremely well read.
