I always thought how beautiful and mysterious Helen sounded when she spoke Polish to her Mom (my Grandmother) . I loved how she would wait to add something unexpected to the conversation when Ben and my Dad would be solving the world's problems. It was usually a "zinger" that got everyone laughing, followed by "anyone want more iced tea?"

She taught us all not to take ourselves too seriously.

The last time we spoke she sounded the same as when I was a little boy in short pants hugging her and saying good by as I climbed back into that family station wagon for the long ride back to California.

I miss summers at the lake and I will miss my Aunt Helen.
