“ I was given the opportunity to develop a new unit move system for the Marine Corps, Navy and Coast Guard and was graciously welcomed by the ICODES program office to prosecute the initiative. Shortly after I joined the program office, a valued member of the ICODES team moved on to another assignment. To all our benefit, Lance successfully navigated the hiring process and joined our team. To my personal benefit, Marty directed Lance’s primary responsibility to support my effort at the time.

Our project had limited time and resources, many people we worked with in governmental circles expressed deep concern that we could achieve any level of success. However, Lance and I always dismissed this skepticism. We were both Marines (Lance a former Marine at this point), we had been given a mission, we were resolved to carry it out to the best of our ability, and failure was not an option. This attitude was a part of his DNA. Lance’s magnanimity sustained our optimism and was the engine that drove us through all the obstacles.

Lance I were both in the Marine Corps with the common experience of having to navigate the very complex processes associated with moving Marines and their equipment to almost everywhere in the world. The best logistics is silent, and it appears to happen like magic to those that it serves but that does not mean that it happens easily or without significant effort or without many personal sacrifices of the people who enable it. Lance understood that this project was an opportunity to ease some of those pains for those who enable them. We set our expectations of what we could accomplish as high as we could imagine.

We were blessed with having a brilliant software developer that was up to our challenge. However, a byproduct of having them work on our project was that they constantly asked very difficult questions that Lance and I had to answer. There were many days that we sat next to each other in the office and received a very long email filled with questions that made both of us suck our teeth with concern. As it turned out, the governmental business of moving our military was riddled with paradoxes, contradictions, and deviations from established policies, business practices, and procedures. All these

matters required Lance and I to provide solid guidance and decision making that could be translated into software. It required the deepest level of research and to stretch ourselves farther than we could imagine. Lance delved into this work tenaciously and with unbridled optimism that we could figure it out, even when I was in doubt. He was an exceptional compatriot and comrade. He was an unwavering positive influence for me and the people we worked around, ready with a joke, a smile, or a perspective that made things not so gloomy. He was an exceptional wingman, battle buddy, and co-worker.

Only through a perfect combination of talents from a lot of people did Lance and I manage to produce a product on time and at cost. My time at the ICODES program office ended but Lance remained, excelled, and continued to work on the problems, advancing the technology, and progressed to resolve some of the most complex challenges within the industry.

All this being said, I am sure his greatest achievements were not through his professional work. I knew as much as I could through our professional relationship and friendship of his great love for his role as a father and husband. I cannot express how deeply I feel his loss nor possibly enumerate all the ways. I weep for his family and pray for God to give them strength to endure his loss.

“When I think of Lance, I don’t just remember a boss or a colleague—I remember a friend, a mentor, and a leader who made every day at work feel a little lighter and a lot more meaningful. Lance had a way of filling the office with laughter, warmth, and a sense of belonging that’s hard to put into words, but I’ll try.

From the moment you walked in, you could count on Lance to greet you with a genuine smile and a “How are you doing?”—and he meant it. He didn’t just ask out of habit; he listened, he cared, and he remembered the little things. If you had a big day coming up, he’d check in, ask if you needed anything from him or could help. If you’d accomplished something, no matter how small, he’d make sure you knew he noticed. Praise from Lance was never generic; it was always specific, heartfelt, and often delivered with appreciation that made you feel ten feet tall.

Lance had a gift for caring and making a person feel seen. He put his team and his loved ones before himself, always. If someone needed help, he was the first to offer. His greatest skill – listening, always hearing or seeing you in conversation. Lance never left a stone unturned when it came to finding the right answer or the best way forward. He was relentless in his pursuit of what was right, but always with a sense of humility and humor that made even the toughest days manageable. Then after a serious moment, surprise you with a comment, joke, or quote that would cause a burst of laughter.

And then there were the jokes. Oh, the jokes. Lance had a repertoire that ranged from clean and clever to, well, let’s just say “tastefully tasteless.” He had a knack for telling the kind of stories and one-liners that would make you groan and laugh at the same time. Even on the busiest, most stressful days, he could break the tension with a perfectly timed quip or a story that had everyone in stitches. It wasn’t just the jokes themselves, it was the way he told them, with a twinkle and even mist in his eye and a grin that was impossible not to catch. For example: He would point to an imaginary sign and ask, “Do you know what that sign is for? A member replies, “No, what’s it for”. Lance would reply “To keep the elephants away” ...a joke his grandfather gifted him.

Of course, no memory of Lance would be complete without mentioning those infamous green Converse high-tops. They were the most horrible shade of green you could imagine, and he wore them with pride—no matter what the rest of his outfit looked like. The shoes never matched an outfit, but that was the point. They were a conversation starter, a source of endless teasing, and a symbol of Lance being Lance. Lance often wore a sportscoat he bought second hand (IYKYK) and the length of the sleeves were on the short side. I made the comment one day after noticing they could be longer and asked if he did the wash on high heat when he cleaned the coat, his response almost made me wet myself when he responded with “I’m glad you noticed, I’m tired of holding my arms out so far to keep my wrists warm.”

The atmosphere in our office was always pleasant, full of laughter, and always a place where you felt you belonged—and that was because of Lance. He set the tone, not just with his words, but with his actions. He showed us what it meant to lead with kindness, to work with integrity, and to live with joy. He taught us to celebrate our successes, to support each other through challenges, and to never underestimate the power of a well-timed joke or a pair of ridiculous shoes.

Lance was young, but he was wise beyond his years. He earned respect not by demanding it, but by giving it freely to others. He made us better—better workers, better teammates, and better people. His legacy isn’t just in the work we did together, but in the way he made us feel and the memories we’ll carry with us always. We miss you, Lance. Thank you for the laughter, the lessons, and the love you gave so freely. Our lives are brighter because of you.

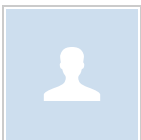
