



Paul Richard Meyerand

July 8, 1933 - January 27, 2024

Paul Richard Meyerand, a longtime Warren resident, husband, father, grandfather and great grandfather died on January 27, 2024. He was 90 years old.

Paul was born July 8, 1933 in Quincy, Illinois, the second son of Carl and Helen Meyerand. Paul graduated from Quincy High School in 1951 where he was an all-state football and tennis player. He went on to attend Valparaiso University where he played varsity football for four years. Following graduation, he married his high school sweetheart, Norma Meyer, in June 1955 before moving to Detroit, Michigan to begin a career with General Motors. Paul worked at General Motors on the financial staff for 32 years before retiring in 1987. Paul and Norma had three children - Mike, Mark and Sue - and were married for 65 years. Along with building and enjoying his family, Paul was also an avid hunter and fisherman, was a classic car collector and an elder for 50 years at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Warren. Paul particularly enjoyed time at his cabin up north near Gaylord where he spent countless weeks enjoying the outdoors with his children and grandchildren for more than 40 years.

Paul is survived by his three children; Mike (Sue) Meyerand, Mark Meyerand and Sue (Brian) Williams. He has five grandchildren; Steven (Monica) Meyerand, Cindy (James) Shiftan, Julia Williams, Rachel (Michael) Ferner

and Esther (Joel) Allen. Paul is also survived by nine great grandchildren — Sophia Meyerand, McKayla Meyerand, Elle Shiftan, Ernie Shiftan, George Shiftan, Sam Shiftan, Asa Allen, Ezra Allen and Noelle Allen.
