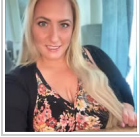

“ I was just thinking about my first boss, Rob, at the Robert Thomas Agency, and decided to look him up. I’m saddened to see that he passed away 8 years ago. I know I’m late to post a memory but I still wanted to, in case his family sees it.

Rob made a big difference in my life as a high schooler back in 1998. I was looking to work my first real job half the day, and finish my senior year the other half of the day.

I interviewed for the secretary job, as I had no real work experience and was just 17. However; after a long interview, Rob saw my potential and told me I was “overqualified for the secretary position,” that I should be a sales agent for him!

I was surprised and a little intimidated by the idea of 17 year old me booking bands and DJs for weddings and corporate events in the Metro-Detroit area!

But Rob gave me confidence in my natural business abilities and encouraged me. He taught me so much about business and sales. He really mentored me and cared about me. He valued my input. My co-workers there taught me a lot, too.

He loved his wife and kids and was a good adult male figure in my life.

As a teen who had lost her dad to cancer at 9, it really meant a lot to me.

He believed in my music career and booked me on my first professional singing gig when I was just 17. I got to sing Celine Dion’s “Power of Love” to a couple at a park.

That time at RTA gave me a great foundation for my career in the entertainment business. I went on to start my own family. In fact, Rob was the DJ at my wedding. I then started my own talent agency at the age of 24. I represented 225+ actors, models, and voice talent successfully in Utah for 12 years before I sold my agency to do other roles in the film industry. I became a video producer, casting director, writer, and director.

I have 2 boys that have benefitted from having a mom who also is a businesswoman.

I often think about my first job and how blessed I was to have such a great boss and opportunity in my hometown.
