October 4, 1936 - February 29, 2024

Ronald Arthur Maisonneuve, 87, returned to His heavenly home on February 29, 2024. His devotion to his family and firm belief in God as an active Knight with the Knights of Columbus for 60 years supported him in his struggles and ultimately brought him peace.

Ronald was born to the late Armand and Alice Maisonneuve, in Detroit, Michigan on October 4, 1936. He married Sylvia Catherine Sokloski on October 11, 1958. Together they moved to California where he served in the Navy. He was a cook on a submarine, leaving behind a legacy of shared experiences, remembered for his contributions to the tight-knit community below the waves.

While navigating the world of textile and drapery sales industry with various companies, he raised two children, Craig and Kim. The family took many memorable camping trips with their travel trailer. He offered a steadfast support for his son's hockey pursuits and his daughter's involvement in gymnastics, dance and piano. 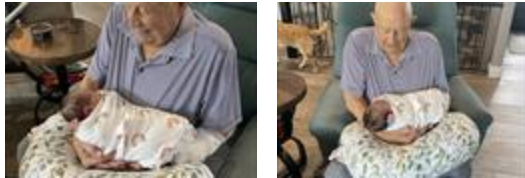
