Valerie "Val" Ogier, a beloved matriarch and vibrant spirit, passed away peacefully on February 16, 2026 at the age of 84. Born on November 19, 1941, Val led a life rich with accomplishment, compassion, and love that left an indelible mark on all who had the fortune of knowing her.

Val's life was a beautiful tapestry woven with love for her family and friends. She cherished her husband, Charles Ogier, with whom she shared almost 50 years of marriage. Their bond was one of mutual admiration and unwavering support, a partnership that stood as a testament to enduring love. Together, they built a life filled with laughter, warm memories, and a family that flourished under their guidance.

Val is survived by her son, John Ogier, and two daughters, Yvonne (Chris) Jordan and Dawn (David) Lyons. Val took great pride in her family, and her legacy continues through her grandchildren Abigail Grant, Benjamin Jordan, Bryan Jordan, and Allison Grant, as well as her step-grandchildren Blake, Janelle and Cooper Lyons. She was affectionately known as "Ama."

In 1999, Chuck and Val became certified facilitators for Low Vision Support and co-founded the Shelby Low Vision Support Group, continuing their commitment to helping others.

She graduated from Nativity High School in 1959 and went on to attend the University of Detroit before it had “Mercy”. She graduated from the University of Detroit in 1963 with a bachelor’s in philosophy. She received a Master of Arts (Education) from the University of Michigan in 1968. She loved to tell people that she was the only person she knew who graduated without taking a math class.

Val began substitute teaching with Warren Consolidated Schools and soon became a dynamic classroom teacher. She started at Frost, moved to Wilde when Frost closed, and ended her career at Carter Middle School. She taught all grade levels from first through sixth. She retired from WCS in 1998.

Not quite ready to hang up her hat, Val went on to work at Oakland University, where she helped guide a new generation of teachers on their path to graduation.

Val lived in Shelby Township on Lake Tiara for 30 years before moving to Pomeroy Assisted Living in Sterling Heights in 2024.

As we remember Val, let us carry forward her spirit of creativity, generosity, and humor, cherishing every moment and preserving the love she so freely

gave. She may have left this world, but her legacy lives on in the hearts of those she touched.

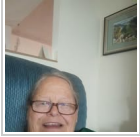

“ *Mrs. Ogier left a lasting impression on me that has stayed with me well into adulthood. During the 1979–80 school year, just as I was turning 10 years old, I was placed in the 5th/6th grade split class with her. She was larger than life—loving, strong, and tough when you needed her to be.*

Being in a split class with students nearly two years older than I was not easy, especially at just 54 pounds. I was small, shy, meek, and lacked self-confidence. Yet she always seemed to see beyond that. I often felt she knew my deepest struggles—my anxiety, the challenges in my home life. She pushed me outside my comfort zone, but she was always there with a much-needed hug, too.

Her voice stayed with me through some of life's most difficult journeys. I'm not sure I would have the strength I carry today if she hadn't helped instill it in me during such an impressionable time in my childhood.
